Court Appointed Special Advocates act as a voice for children who are in the custody of the State of Wyoming because they have been abused or neglected. CASA volunteers, during the past year, assisted in keeping 75% of the families they assisted together.



One father wrote:

“My girlfriend and I were approaching the rock bottom of life by using drugs and putting our children in danger. We got a wake up call when our children were taken into protective custody and we both went to jail.



Four months later we got out of jail and started working a case plan. At that time, we didn't even know CASA existed and we were feeling overwhelmed with everything we were being asked to do. Our Department of Family Services caseworker got a hold of someone at CASA and he came to talk to us about being parents. Our CASA worker went out of his way to help us do the right thing for our children.



It has taken us nine months to obtain custody of our lovely children and I credit three people. Our D.F.S. caseworker, our attorney and our CASA volunteer.”
